#### **BAPTISMAL PROMISES:**

"As you rejoice in the baptism of your child, you are also entrusted with responsibilities:

to live with them among God's faithful people,

bring them to the word of God and the holy supper,

teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments,

place in their hands the holy scriptures, and nurture them in faith and prayer, so that your child may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help your children grow in the Christian faith and life?"


4. How do you see your baptismal promises tying into the gifts?

These <u>Baptismal Promises</u> you've been writing about are promises that parents make for their children when their child is baptized. You'll be hearing a lot about them during your time in Confirmation—because when you're confirmed, you'll take these promises and make them

your own. After Confirmation, it becomes your responsibility to fulfill these promises in the way you live and love like Jesus. ©
