

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Greetings!

Christmas decorating traditionally happens in our house on the Friday after Thanksgiving. But, our living room isn't typically ready to receive our Christmas tree, and furniture migrates and condenses into other corners to make way. While there is much celebration in the decorating, the relocation of the furniture is not glamorous. This making space that happens every year reveals the areas missed by the vacuum and reminds me that I am progressing in years, and can no longer simply move the couch by myself. I would not have it any other way; wedging the Christmas tree into our living room for a month (or two!) is worth the effort. It is the visible reminder of Christ's birth and the joyous celebrating that comes with it.

Advent reminds us that our usual ways of doing things do not fit this season. In Advent, we need to make room for the coming Christ child, and all that Christmas brings with it: Christmas lights, decorations, ornaments, trees, wreaths, cookies, presents, stockings, eggnog, Ham, meatballs, and so on. Christmas invades our lives, and it does so in remarkably tangible ways. How wonderful it is to see the amazing Christmas lights, to smell the cedar and peppermint and pine, to taste the cookies you only get once a year, and to hear the wonderful old, familiar tunes of Christmas.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Prepare him room means that our lives will be upended, but also changed by the new configurations of our lives. One of the lessons we learn as we prepare is that family traditions merge, that time changes who we are and what we can do, that we try to prepare and plan, only to feel like sometimes we've fallen short. Yet, the arrival of the Christ child turns our focus toward grace. Christ's bursting into our world is not meant to create anxiety, doubt, or guilt. Instead, the birth of Jesus declares today and into our future that we are enough just as we are. Christmas is a time to celebrate God has come to live with us. To invade our living rooms, kitchen, and lives with a God who announces that you are loved... forever! The magic of Christmas is realizing just how much the season inhabits our entire lives.

Prepare him room! Christ is coming, breaking into your lives in ways you may not expect. But, bringing grace upon grace. Whether we are ready or not, Jesus comes and lives among us,

and so we celebrate on Christmas day with cookies, carols, and gifts.
Awake, and greet the new morn!


As we continue to grow and dream together, please keep our leadership and congregation in your prayers. We remain committed to approaching every decision with discernment, transparency, and trust.







The Piecemaker Quilt Group has been busy creating for those in our community. In November, 165 quilts & 108 scent clothes were blessed during worship service.

Since they started in 2017, the LCC Quilters have made:

1,967 total quilts

- 1,710 to RRCAC
- 257 to RMHC

652 scent clothes for Sanford NICU

West Fargo Eats Updates

We are grateful to share several meaningful updates from the past

month.

First, West Fargo Eats received a generous \$2,500 donation from the West Fargo Exchange Club, which will directly support our food security work in the community.

We have continued to work closely with counselors in the West Fargo

Public Schools. Together, we'll be preparing monthly food boxes for families in need and helping keep school counselor offices stocked with staple items for students who seek support.

October Distribution Recap

Including our final fall pop-up, October's impact reached:

- 415 households (1,212 individuals)
- 426 children, 513 adults, 273 seniors
- 14,177 pounds of food distributed

Current Urgent Needs:

- Small bag/box of rice
- Small canned chicken
- Cereal
- Cream soups
- Egg noodles










November Community Food Crisis Response

Thanks to remarkable community support and volunteer power, we held two significant emergency response events in November.



November 14 Distribution

- 190 families served
- 327 children, 303 adults, 72 seniors
- 5,240 lbs of food distributed
- 72 volunteers giving 138 hours
 - This total includes the efficient and dedicated work of volunteers who organized and packed 250 boxes on November 13 in preparation for the distribution.

November 20 Pop-Up

- 183 families served
- 253 children, 311 adults, 98 seniors
- 5,240 lbs of food distributed
- 51 volunteers giving 76.5 hours

Combined Two Day Community Crisis Response Event Totals

- 373 families served across both events
- 10,480 pounds of food distributed
- 123 volunteers contributing 214.5 hours


